September 24th (Thursday), 2009 Meeting: Dan Hollis - VP of Geophysics and Technology Development, Seismic Imaging Solutions Company, LLC (SISCO) Will speak on . . .

"A Recent 2D Seismic Program in the Long Beach/Signal Hill, CA Area – A Model for Urban Seismic Exploration"

Speaker Abstract

Seismic exploration in an urban environment has always presented problems to conventional seismic crews and equipment. recording cables and other ground equipment present a "trip-and-fall" safety hazard to the general public and are exposed to damage or theft. Seismic vibrators, or "survey trucks", can cause unacceptable levels of vibration and/or noise to under and above-ground structures, local businesses and residents. Finally, the urban environment with traffic, construction and other facilities is very noisy and causes significant signal-to-noise issues with relatively weak seismic signal.

In July 2009, Seismic Imaging Solutions Company (SISCO) acquired four 2-D seismic lines in the Long Beach/Signal Hill area to test "urban-friendliness" new of exploration procedures and equipment. This talk will review this survey's planning and field operations with particular attention to the procedures and equipment that contributed to a successful urban-friendly operation.

Speaker Biography

Dan Hollis has worked in the seismic exploration industry since 1981. Prior to SISCO, Dan has worked for CGGVeritas, Subsurface Exploration Company, Geophysical Systems Corporation and Western Geophysical. Most of his career Dan has been based in the Los Angeles area, but has worked areas in the U.S., Alaska, Australia, China and Thailand. He received his

Bachelor of Science degree in Earth Science from Calif. State University at Long Beach in 1980. Dan is a member of AAPG, SEG, LABGS, RMAG and PBGS.
