<u>March 24th (Thursday)</u> **Bob Poole,** Manager, Production Regions and State Waste Issues, Western States Petroleum Assoc.; **will speak on:**

Abundant, Reliable and Affordable Fuel in a Low Carbon World

Abstract

Talk highlights will focus on the complex challenges we all face in continuing to provide the essential energy to drive our economy and, hence our way of life in light of ever-increasing regulations. Topics that will be touched on are Current World Energy Reserves and Global Oil and U.S. Fuel Consumption, Growth Rate Forecasts, and access to our Domestic Energy Resources. The projected implementation costs/benefits of both California's Landmark AB32 "Global Warming Solutions Act" legislation and its companion "Low Carbon Fuel Standard" Executive Order will be discussed. California's development of a process to differentiate the "carbon intensities" of various fuel feed stocks through a Life Cycle Analysis process and the potential impacts from this effort on our ability to use our own state's petroleum resources will be explored. Lastly, Bob will touch on a variety of other "priority" issues facing California in general and the Petroleum Industry specifically.

Bob is the Manager of Production Regions for the Western States Petroleum Association or WSPA.
