Enhanced Geothermal Systems

Abstract

We live on a trillion cubic kilometers of molten rock. Geothermal energy seems like a nobrainer: sink some deep wells, circulate hot water, and drive turbines. How hard can it be? Really hard, as it turns out. Now that most of the natural geothermal flow systems have been tapped, we need to make new systems using "enhanced geothermal methods". This will unprecedented take collaboration engineers and geologists, but the potential is By some estimates, enhanced enormous. geothermal energy could meet the world's current energy needs for millennia. We will discuss some of the technology advances that will be needed to get there and what we are doing at CSULB. Our efforts are aimed at understanding the "geologic plumbing" geothermal flow systems and the development of characterization tools to predict help good systems and fix poor ones.

Speaker's Biography

Matthew Becker is a Professor of Geological Sciences and the Bert Conrey Endowed Chair in

Hydrogeology at California State University, Long Beach. He earned his B.S. in geology at Michigan State University, his M.S. and Ph.D. in civil engineering at University of Texas-Austin, and has held positions at the U.S. Geological Survey, Los Alamos Laboratories, NASA Goddard, the University of Buffalo, and the University of Trento, Italy. His research is focused on how water, heat, and chemicals migrate through fractured bedrock systems.
