THE JONAH GAS FIELD, SUBLETTE COUNTY, WYOMING: RECENT DEVELOPMENTS

Abstract

The Jonah Field is a world-class, tight-gas unconventional reservoir located in Sublette County, Wyoming. It lies in the southeastern portion of the Hoback Basin, a northwestern extension of the Greater Green River Basin. The principal target in this field is the Lance Formation, a 2,000 to 3,000 foot thick, fluvial-dominated Cretaceous-Tertiary interval. This field was one of the largest onshore U.S. natural gas discoveries of the 1990s. Jonah Energy and its predecessors (McMurray Oil Company, Alberta Energy, and Encana Corporation) have been continuously drilling there since 1998.

As of 2015, it is the second-largest gas producing field in Wyoming, and the fourth-largest oil field there due to its condensate yield, 2,399,459 bbl. Despite recent commodities price fluctuations, Jonah Energy has continued successfully infill drilling 5-8 acre spaced wells. In fact, in 2016, Jonah Energy's percentage of the Wyoming drill rig count increased to currently 25 percent. Several key advances have shaped this progress, in both economics and reservoir characterization. Costs have dropped from May 2014 to May 2016 due to efficiencies in reduced drilling cycle times, completions efficiencies, and general cost reductions.

Recent advances in reservoir characterization have enabled continued infill development. Due to the lenticular, stacked fluvial packages that dominate the Lance Pool, sand body geometries and the lack of key correlation markers complicate the stratigraphy in the Jonah Field. The implementation of a proportional depth curve to bracket the Lance Pool into consistent

intervals better highlights the field's depositional trends, allowing for more efficient completions strategies. The creation of an algorithm to estimate reservoir pressures during early flowback, in combination with early production performance, assists in understanding reservoir productivity. These current advances and others for the Jonah Field will be discussed.

Speaker's Biography

Katherine (Katie) Kovac is a Senior Geologist at Jonah Energy in Denver, Colorado. She has 15 years professional experience as a geologist, mostly in California. Currently, she is working the Jonah Gas Field in Wyoming and A&D projects. Previous to Jonah Energy, she worked at Occidental Petroleum in Long Beach for 5 years. Originally an East Coaster, from New Jersey, she has spent her geologic career out West, with positions in Salt Lake City, Bakersfield, Long Beach, and Denver.

Her expertise is in the energy industry, with experience in Geothermal, Oil, and Natural Gas. She received both a B.S. and M.S. in Geology (Thesis: *Geologic Framework and Paragenesis of the Coso Geothermal Field, CA*) from the University of Utah. After moving from Bakersfield to Long Beach, Katie founded the Los Angeles/Orange County Chapter of the AWG (Association for Women Geoscientists) in 2012 in Long Beach. She has previously served as LABGS Vice President and Program Chair. By serving as AWG President-Elect 2017, Katie hopes to give back to and champion AWG and its members and to promote its LA/OC Chapter!
